Christopher Doner is the founder of Kaze Group; a service company comprised of two distinct elements that serve to provide both consulting services and training to private individuals and domestic organizations. He served five years as a member of a corporate security team for a Fortune 500 company. Mr. Doner has over 25 years of martial arts training and is a subject matter expert in close-combat and self-protection. He has earned instructor credentials in Robert Bussey's Warrior International (RBWI), Rosenbach Warrior Training Branches and Jensen Knife Combatives. He is trained exclusively in WWII and modern combatives under the personal guidance of the late Robert Ethan Jensen and has completed several Combative Tactics and Survival Systems (CTSS) courses taught by CTSS founder, Devin Crinklaw. In addition to these disciplines, he has trained in Brazilian JiuJitsu, Filipino martial arts, and Togakure-ryu Ninjutsu.

Doner has worked numerous private personal security details and served as a member of a large corporate security force that was entrusted with the security of various VIPs', foreign dignitaries, company executives and employees. He assisted the United States Secret Service as part of a security force in place during one of President George W. Bush's visit to Omaha in 2005. He has taught close combat seminars for Creighton University's ROTC program and wilderness survival methods as part of the ROTC's Jr. Ranger Indoctrination Program (RIP). He is an active member of a nuclear site protection team trained in various small arms techniques, tactics and procedures.
